

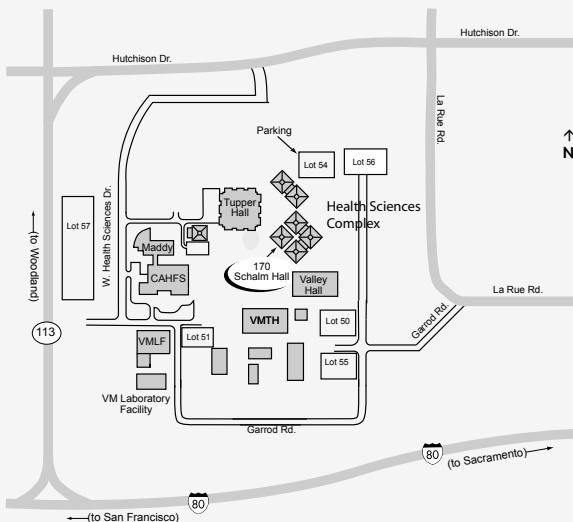
DRIVING DIRECTIONS:

Dr. Dick Mansmann is a fourth-generation horse person with his VMD from the University of Pennsylvania in 1968. His basic clinical training began as an intern and PhD student under Drs. Wheat and Osburn at UC Davis. Charlie Heumphreus was very instrumental in moving forward his interest in equine podiatry as the basis of successful horse health and performance. He has been involved with writing several scientific articles, chapters and books, including the third edition of *Equine Medicine and Surgery*, *Equine Lameness*, and most recently, *Equine Podiatry*. He was the 13th inductee into the

American Farriers' Journal International Hall of Fame for veterinarians. Currently, he is the Director of the Equine Health Program and Podiatry and Rehabilitation Service at the North Carolina State University College of Veterinary Medicine in Raleigh.
