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**POSITION AVAILABLE:** Assistant, Associate or Full Professor of Theriogenology (tenure track).

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**SALARY:** Dependent on qualifications and experience

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**QUALIFICATIONS:** Veterinarian with advanced training in Theriogenology. Board certification or eligibility in the American College of Theriogenologists and/or the European College of Animal Reproduction is required. PhD preferred. Clinical experience and competence in equine reproduction is required. Experience and competence in reproductive management of other animal species, particularly companion animals and wildlife is desired. Demonstrated aptitude/experience or potential in teaching. Documented research record or potential to develop an independent research program in population control / contraception is preferred. Must possess excellent interpersonal and communication skills and a demonstrated ability to work with others in a collegial team atmosphere.

**RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Teaching: Responsibilities include: 1) participation in lectures and laboratories in the DVM professional curriculum; 2) clinical teaching in the Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital (VMTH); 3) participation in the graduate clinical (resident) training program of the VMTH; and 4) participation in the graduate academic programs (MS and PhD) of the campus.

Clinical: The position includes a 50% clinical commitment to the Equine Reproduction Service of the VMTH (subject to annual review). The individual will be responsible for directing, instructing and supervising veterinary students and house officers; providing health care and service to patients; and advising and consulting with referring veterinarians and clients.

Research: The development of a creative, independent and productive basic and/or clinically-oriented research program is a requirement of the position. Individual will provide leadership in directing research projects of residents and graduate students.

Service: University and public service through committee work, participation in professional organizations, continuing education and other appropriate means is required.
